Board Chair and CEO's Report

When this year started no one could have foreseen the unprecedented times that were to come. We entered into the beginning of our fiscal year in April, 2019 with a laser-like focus on one of the Board's strategic priorities to ensure our role at the forefront of Ontario's healthcare system transformation by taking leadership as one of the core partners involved with four successful applications for the new Ontario Health Teams (OHTs)- two now approved, two in development- and an invitation to participate in a fifth one.

Then, with the turbulent international declaration of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic in March, 2020, CHATS was drawn into catastrophe management mode. Keeping our clients, volunteers and staff safe became job one; continuing to provide services and maintaining connectivity with our clients, our goal.

No one would have expected the degree or length to which the COVID-19 pandemic and provincial state of emergency would affect us all. From the initial expectation of a few weeks, to now heading into months of "lockdown", CHATS has demonstrated the unparalleled value that home and community supports provide to vulnerable older adults in York Region and South Simcoe, keeping them well supported, engaged and connected.

Even in the face of great adversity, CHATS continues to demonstrate resiliency, willingness to adapt, innovate and provide leadership. But COVID-19 does not define us—as you will see in this report, CHATS has been able to improve, enhance and expand the important services we provide to a growing and diverse older adult population, with increasingly complex care needs.

As always, we would not be able to do any of this without our dedicated team here at CHATS. Thanks to our Board of Directors, devoted volunteers, staff, service partners, suppliers, funders and donors, this year our community has gone above and beyond to quickly come together to ensure CHATS was able to provide supports safely where we could, and with minimal disruption to the exceptional service CHATS provides to more than 8,500 older adults and caregivers in York Region and South Simcoe. To our clients and caregivers, we thank you for your trust and confidence in the services and supports you receive from us, each and every day.

Amidst the current uncertainty, there is one thing for certain: we will continue to work hard to efficiently and creatively deliver programs to support our vision that older adults can live independently, safely and well at home.

Operational Highlights

Assisted Living Shift Model Change

Since April of last year, our Assisted Living team has been working hard to modify five of the nine Assisted Living sites to a new shift model to provide frontline staff with more fulltime hours and job satisfaction, by utilizing 12-hour and 8-hour shifts. This change has been well received, with staff noting that they feel more refreshed, rested and less stressed, and are enjoying the additional free time this shift model has afforded to catch up with their family. For the 2020-21 year, we look forward to rolling this model out to the remaining sites.

Southlake@Home

Aligning with CHATS' strategic priority to partner with local hospitals to reduce their Alternative Level of Care (ALC) rates, CHATS was asked to participate in Southlake@Home. This innovative new program was funded to provide 16-week transitional care and support to frail elderly patients who were on an inpatient service at Southlake Regional Health Centre, with a focus on clients who are deemed ALC, or likely to be ALC. New protocols are being developed for hospital to home transitions, with increased flexibility in the way in which services are wrapped around client needs, demonstrating the value of community support services in addressing system level challenges. This is an exciting project for CHATS, allowing us to expand our involvement with Southlake to include the provision of respite care, home help, assisted living, transportation, Meals on Wheels, adult day services, home adaptation and maintenance, caregiver support or transportation services, as needed. CHATS is actively involved in program planning and is part of the Southlake@Home Champions Team and Steering Committee. CHATS was delighted to be included and recognized as part of the team selected to win Southlake's "Courage to Think Differently" Award in October, 2019.

MackenzieHelps

Continuing on our mission to demonstrate the positive impact of community support services on system level pressures, CHATS enlisted as a partner in the MackenzieHelps pilot project alongside SE Health and Mackenzie Health in the fall of 2019. A 16-week program, MackenzieHelps provides a combination of home and community care to help older adults with complex care needs safely leave the hospital to continue their care in the comfort of their own home. The program was launched in October following a \$2.1 million investment from the Government of Ontario to Mackenzie Health.

For this project, CHATS was able to dedicate a fulltime driver with a wheelchair accessible vehicle for immediate transition home, provide additional and enhanced Adult Day Program services, as well as commit a part-time Caregiver Education Counsellor to help those now caring for their loved one at home.

COVID-19 Response

The COVID-19 global pandemic has been one of the most unprecedented and challenging times in modern history. It has also been an opportunity for CHATS to prove itself as a leader and innovator. Our staff and volunteers worked tirelessly to help clients and the community remain supported while sheltering at home. Overnight, our congregate gatherings turned virtual, utilizing technology to keep the community we serve safe during isolation. We enhanced our Meals on Wheels program and added new grocery shopping and prescription delivery service, so our clients didn't have to put themselves at risk by going out into the community. We also partnered with a variety of organizations to protect the vulnerable members of our community with supports such as culturally specific food hampers free of charge, and leading a group of community organizations to develop the COVID-19 response site for the Eastern York Region North Durham Ontario Health Team catchment area.

CHATS is an integral partner in Ontario Health Teams and health system transformation

In the spring of 2019, the Ontario Government launched its plan to implement Ontario Health Teams for a more integrated approach to improving access and services for patients and families. As a core partner, CHATS has played an integral role in the development of four OHT applications—Eastern York Region North Durham (EYRND) OHT, Southlake Community OHT, South Simcoe OHT, and Western York Region (WYR) OHT. CHATS has also been invited to participate in the North York Toronto Partners OHT. Together, these five OHTs cover the mass geographic area in which CHATS serves, and provides a significant opportunity for CHATS to be directly involved in the forefront of healthcare system transformation, reinforcing the important role and value of the in-home and community supports we provide to older adults and their caregivers. Highlights include:

- The Southlake Community OHT will start by focusing on older adults with complex healthcare needs and adults with mental health and addiction challenges.
- The Eastern York Region/North Durham (EYRND) OHT will begin with a focus on the development of integrated services for mental health and addictions, and dementia care for patients and their caregivers within the Markham, Stouffville, Thornhill, Uxbridge and Brock communities.
- The Western York Region (WYR) OHT —currently awaiting approval— will serve residents of Vaughan, Richmond Hill and King, and residents of adjacent municipalities of Aurora, Markham, Brampton and Toronto. In Year 1, the target population is medically and socially complex frail older adults.
- The South Simcoe OHT—still under development at this time— will be located in the South Simcoe sub-region catchment, west of the 400 corridor. In response to the local pressures of the aging community in that area, the year one population focus will be seniors.
- As CHATS also serves clients who live in the northern part of Toronto, or who utilize health care services and the hospital in that area, we've been invited to participate in the North York Toronto Health Partners. This OHT will start by focusing frail seniors, those with mental health and addiction issues, and those at end of life.

Client and Family Caregiver Advisory Council

The past year saw the re-launch of CHATS' Client and Family Caregiver Advisory Council, with new members and new perspectives. Committee members meet quarterly providing valuable feedback and input on a variety of issues – from client engagement, to discussing our Client Bill of Rights, and from reviewing our client satisfaction results, to describing what "good care" means to them. Members of our Advisory Council were also involved in co-design sessions with several of the OHTs that CHATS is involved with. Their input has been immeasurable, is incorporated into planning and program design, and welcomed by CHATS Board and staff.




